We welcomed 28 new babies into our community this year and actively supported these newborns and many toddlers with our "First Steps" program. Early intervention in child development is one of the best investments we can make in a young person's life.

We are continuing to celebrate a return to pre-pandemic levels of member participation. Enrollment in The Academy, the new name for our adult lifelong learning program that meets on campus Monday through Friday, has reached more than 107 attendees each week! If you have time and would like to brighten your day, come by and volunteer at The Academy. You will get way more than you give. I promise.

Today Down Syndrome of Louisville serves and advocates for 1,299 people with Down syndrome and their families in the Kentuckiana area. This year, we took our show on the road and went out in the community hosting five "pop-up" DSL programming events in neighborhoods where it would be most convenient for families to connect with DSL staff and discover what we do. Without caring and charitable people like you, we could not provide these valuable experiences which make a difference to so many individuals.

Thank you again for all you do for Down Syndrome of Louisville.



#### **OUR REACH**

Down Syndrome of Louisville serves individuals in 26 area counties in Kentucky and Indiana. However, during COVID, our reach went well beyond our local service area. Many families described our services as a "lifeline" for their members. We had individuals join us from at least seven other states. One even moved here to join our family in person.

# **EARLY INTERVENTION**

### REACHING OUR MILESTONES

#### **EARLY INTERVENTION**

Our developmental intervention targets the unique development needs of children beginning from birth through age three and is available at home or at a childcare facility. Our certified Developmental Therapists provide parents with strategies and techniques to further the child's brain development, learning styles, and issues related to a diagnosis of Down Syndrome. In our group classes, parents learn strategies to implement in the community and at home to address their specific developmental goals for their child. Caregivers also provide shared experiences and resources as they network and support one another. Siblings are welcome too!

#### THE GOAL

The Academy is a high-quality lifelong learning experience unlike any other program in the area. The Academy offers a complete educational curriculum, including academics, healthy movement, life-skill classes, social activities, and community outings for adults with Down syndrome that have completed high school.



"DSL has helped Matthew immensely. After being homeschooled, he started with a behavior therapist for his anxiety - he often froze in public and I was not sure if DSL would work for him. 



## **2023 COSTS TO PROVIDE SERVICES:**

- Six weeks Summer Education Enrichment Camp for one child: \$2,500
- Career Support for a member for a year: \$4,268
- One day to operate DSL: \$7,021
- Bi-weekly early intervention for one child from age 0-3: **\$7,100**
- The Academy for one adult, one year (avg. 3x wk): **\$18,000**
- Parent Education for an average of 25 new families each year: \$24,000


