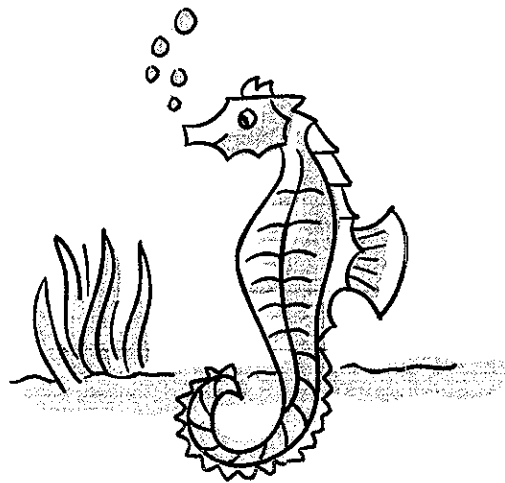


Life in the Sea



There are several excellent nature magazines that contain spectacular photographs. There also are numerous trade books filled with facts and information about sea animals. Provide as many sources as you can so that children acquaint themselves with the subject matter.

Have children select a sea creature that they would like to be. Then have them write about themselves as that animal. What kind of creature would they be? Have them describe themselves and tell about life in the sea. How would they survive and keep safe from their enemies? What would they eat? Would they live alone or with other sea animals?
